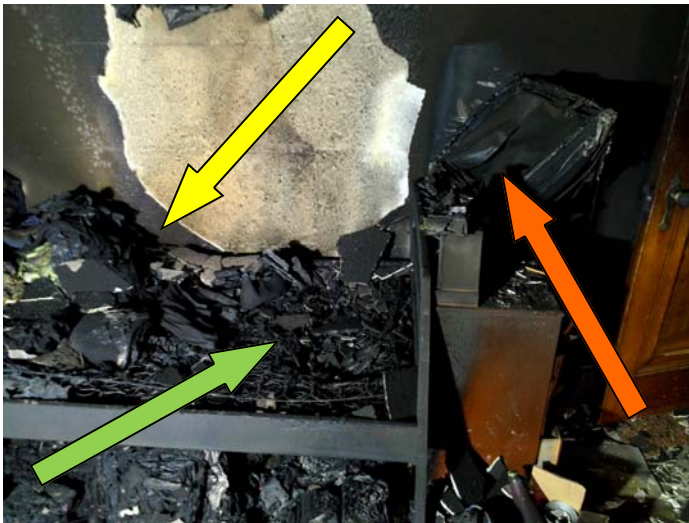


Over 50 Raffle Prizes will be given away on June 30th at the conclusion of Ribs & Raffle.

March 27th - Occupants returned and when they opened the outside door to their home, smelled smoke. They immediately moved away from the house and called 9-1-1.

Firefighters entered the home and discovered that a fire had occurred in a bedroom. The fire had extinguished itself when it ran out of oxygen to sustain combustion. The bedroom walls were lath and plaster - found in many older homes. The plaster thickness provided for a higher level of fire resistance which also limited the spread of the fire.

An investigation as to the fire origin and cause appears to lead to an electrical extension cord (yellow arrows) that had been run along the side of the bed to power a television set located at the foot the bed (orange arrow). The mattress springs lost their tensile strength and collapsed (green arrow) indicating a fire in excess of 750° F. While the flames were confined to the room of origin, smoke and heat damage occurred throughout the remainder of the house.

Fire Prevention Lesson - Look for the UL Mark on extension cords you purchase. The UL Mark means that representative samples of the cord have been tested for foreseeable safety hazards. *Unplug an extension cord plugged in when not in use. The cord will still conduct electricity until it is unplugged from the outlet.*
